Another busy fortnight in school. I was very privileged to be invited to the film celebration event at Sunderland University, for Fulwell Juniors. This short film of 'Macbeth' was quite remarkable for children so young. Their performances were outstanding and it was a pleasure to be able to share the event and to remember the children in their infant years.

We welcomed Lisette Auton, a disabled author, who worked with the children in Year 2. Lisette does 'stuff with words' as a creative practitioner and captured the children's interest, imagination and attention within the sessions she led. The pictures below captured her in action. She spent time with each class and read to them from her books.

Nursery children enjoyed a 'penguin waddle' last Wednesday. Dressed in black and white they all 'waddled' around school as they raised funds to sponsor their own penguin. Staff were understandably exhausted at the end of the day as they waddled around school in costume. The children did this in small groups in the outdoors. They raised £141.35 and staff have begun the 'adoption' of a penguin. More news will follow...



