On Monday 10<sup>th</sup> November we wore odd socks to kick start Anti-bullying week! We had a special assembly and talked about celebrating differences.

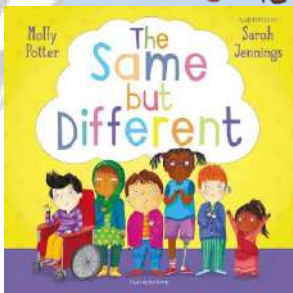


## PARENTS MEETINGS
